The feedback we received endorses our fantastic students and their engagement as our school ambassadors.

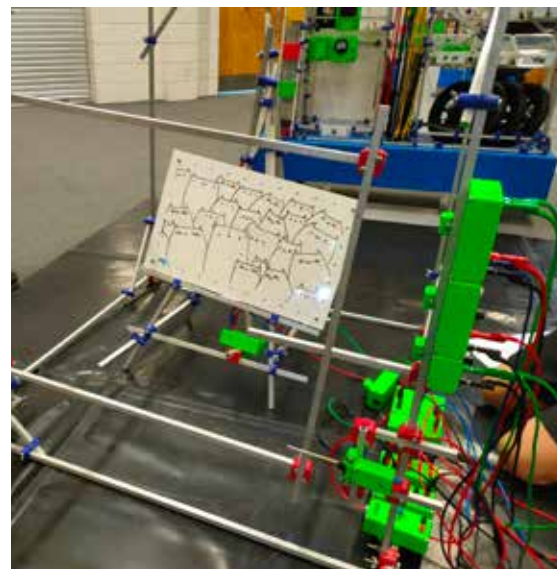
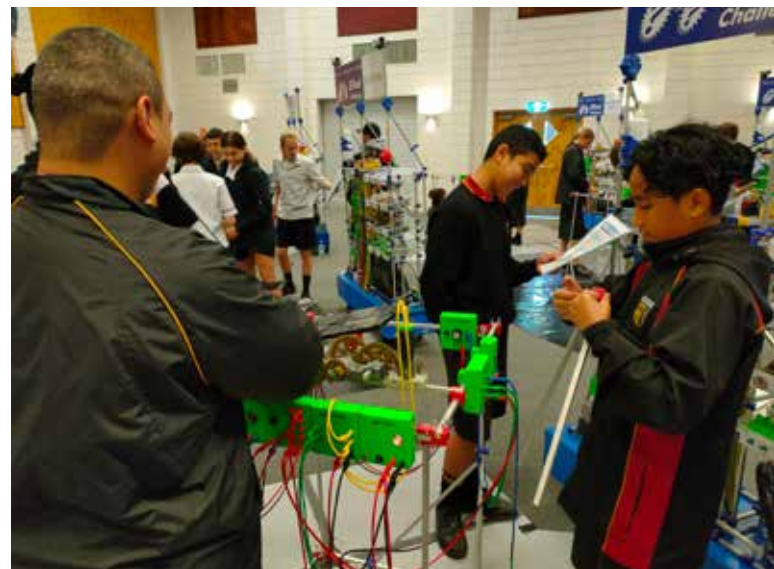
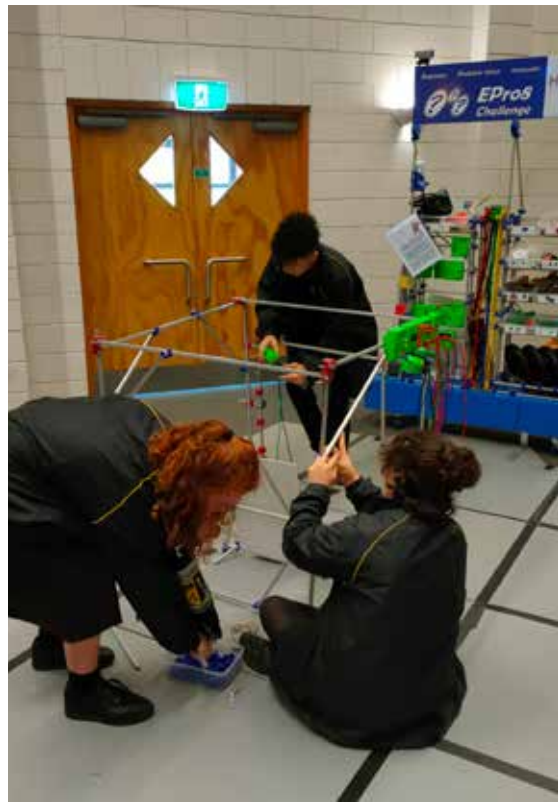

Thanks Ms Durkin and Mr Tahat for inspiring our young STEAM students!

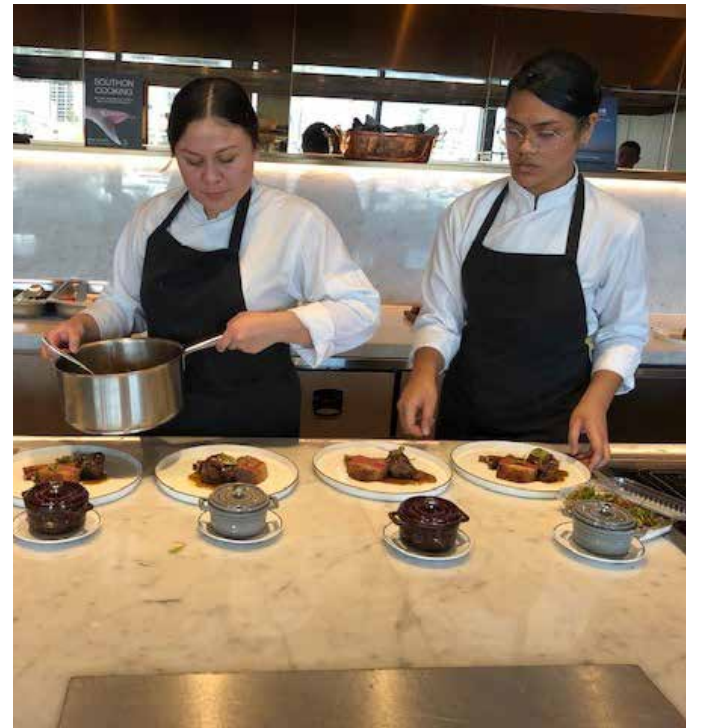


Gateway is a great opportunity for students' to get a taste of working in their chosen career pathway.
