Amazing Race

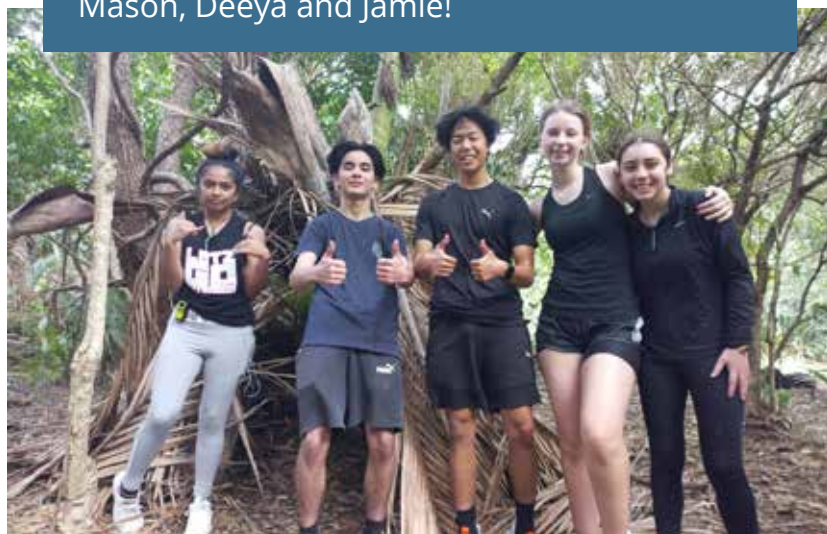


Our Level 2 PE classes tackled the HHS Piha Amazing Race in July!

Students walked around the pā and its earthworks and visited Te Whero's Redoubt. They had a great time exploring the pā site despite the weather on the day!

Five universities, along with various trade and training providers were in attendance, and our students were well prepared with great questions.

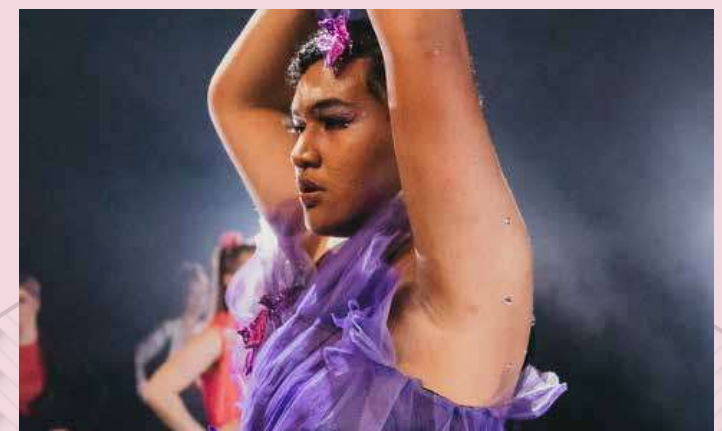
This event is a fantastic opportunity for students to start thinking about what they would like to do for their future career. It was great to see whānau come along to support students on their journey to find their career.



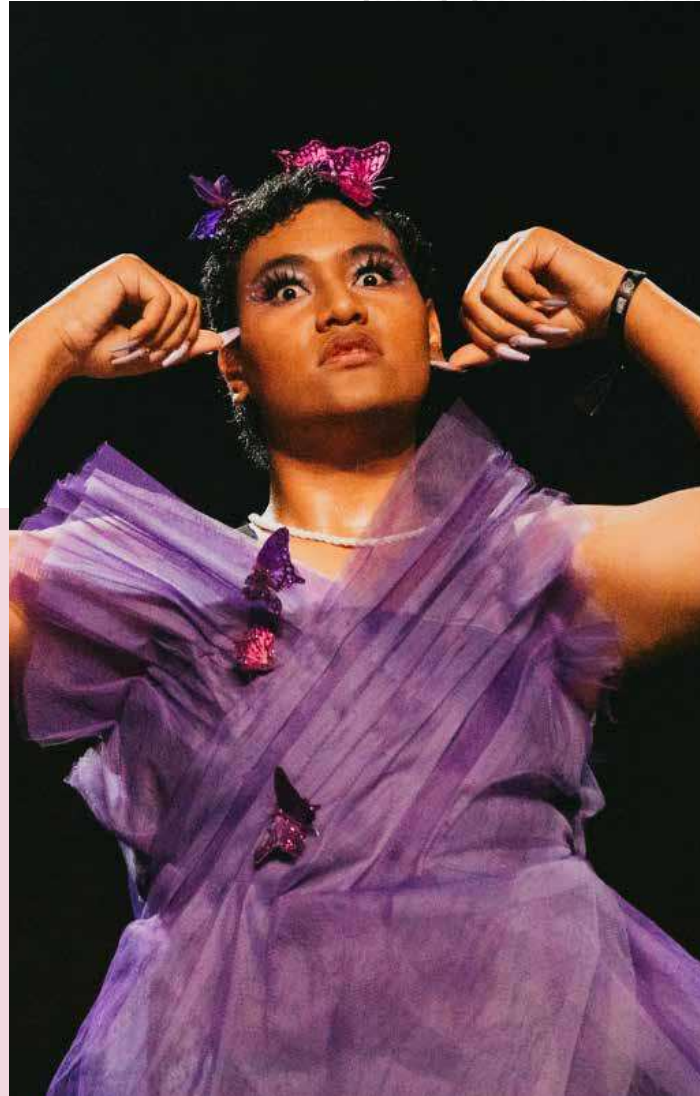

Congratulations to our King & Queen of the Ball, Erich and Angelie!

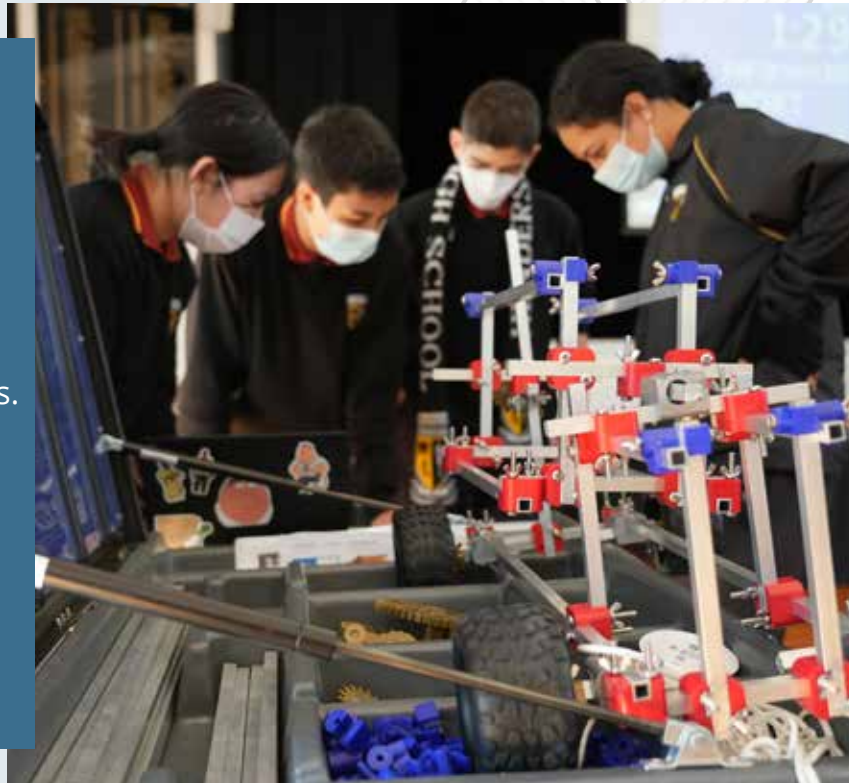


EPRO8 COMPETITION
