


YEAR 9 BBQ WELCOME EVENING

Well done students, we are proud of your efforts in bringing attention to the environmental impact of rubbish on our coastline, and for getting stuck in to make a positive difference!












ASSEMBLY FOR CHRISTCHURCH

SECONDARY SCHOOL LAWN BOWLS





A big thanks to our PE teachers for their specialist guidance, and of course for their vast experience. climbing the walls!



Thanks to all our staff and students for your support and donations, all proceeds went to the Mental Health Foundation.








BP BUSINESS CHALLENGE

A huge thank you to Huw, Nick, Maria, Jim and Niels who took time out of their day to judge our students' creations.








YEAR 10 PHYSICAL EDUCATION


